
2001: A Space Odyssey




BRAVE HEART

Ill think of some way to get him back.


After all,



With a screenplay by Alan Jay Lerner and directed George Cukor, the film depicts poor Cockney flower seller named Doolittle who overhears an arrogant phonetics professor, Henry Higgins, as he casually wagers that he could teach her to speak "proper" English, thereby making her presentable in the high society of Edwardian London.


The highlight of the whole movie is the song The Rain in Spain. It shows the essence of the movie—musical film. The musical film is a film genre in which songs sung by the characters are interwoven into the narrative, sometimes accompanied by dancing. The songs usually advance the plot or develop the film's characters, though in some cases they serve merely as breaks in the storyline, often as elaborate "production numbers".

The musical film was a natural development of the stage musical after the emergence of sound film technology. Typically, the biggest difference between film and stage musicals is the use of lavish background scenery and locations that would be impractical in a theater. Musical films characteristically contain elements reminiscent of theater; performers often treat their song and dance numbers as if there is a live audience watching. In a sense, the viewer becomes the diegetic audience, as the performer looks directly into the camera and performs to it.

Breaking Dawn: Bella and Edward are married, but their honeymoon is cut short when Bella discovers that she is pregnant. She nearly dies giving birth to half-vampire-half-human daughter, Renesmee. Edward injects Bella with his venom to save her life and turns her into a vampire. the Cullens and their witnesses convince the Volturi that the child poses no danger to vampires or their secret, and they are left in peace by the Volturi.


Conclusion

We exhibit our sentiments on social medias to create an illusionary world


where profundity oftentimes triggers confusion and fear.




GONE WITH THE WIND

The film follows the Aboriginal girls as they walk for nine weeks along 1,500 miles of the Australian rabbit-proof fence to return to their community at Jigalong, while being pursued by white law enforcement authorities and an Aboriginal tracker.

—the aboriginal people who are considered as the victims of the "white wash" policy made by the authorities. It makes us to reconsider about the suffering of the Stolen Generation behind their assimilation into the white community.

The decision made by the chief protector of Aborigines deprived their rights of having normal family lives in a violent way.
